

Affordable Housing: Sunnyside Townhouses, the Redevelopment Project & Gateway Apartments offer rental & purchase options for Sheboygan County families.

Critical Home Repairs: Assists qualified applicants with repairs, maintenance & accessibility modifications in Calumet, Door, Kewaunee, Manitowoc & Sheboygan Counties.

Homebuyer Assistance: Provides financial support for upfront costs of purchasing a home in Door, Kewaunee, Manitowoc & Sheboygan Counties.

Energy Assistance (WHEAP): Helps eligible households in Brown, Manitowoc & Ozaukee Counties with heating, electric costs & energy crisis situations.

Weatherization Assistance: Improves energy efficiency through repairs, upgrades & conservation programs for qualified homes in Door, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Northern Milwaukee, Ozaukee & Sheboygan Counties.
